October saw the much anticipated release of Microsoft Windows 7. However the market has quickly been saturated with PC's and portables loaded with the Home Premium variant. At the time of going to press the business based Professional edition still seems limited in its availability. I personally would have thought Microsoft would have gambled more on big sales of their new stream lined operating system to the business sector, but it appears not. My thoughts are based purely on the fact that in general the rather bloated Vista o/s passed by the office environment almost unnoticed. With the oh so popular mini Netbook style portables still at this stage only cable of running XP Home due to low end specifications, and many fixed location PC's/laptops still available with XP as a downgrade, only time will tell whether Windows 7 takes on or not. We are looking to start rolling out sales of new computers running this operating system during December.

We have finally seen a shift in the supply of flat screen monitors. I have mentioned in previous newsletter articles that we would eventually see such a change. A standard 4:3 orientation screen is now more expensive and much harder to source than a widescreen 16:9 / 16:10. 15" and 17" widescreen models are freely available but in my opinion these are a false economy in the limited physical viewing area you actually receive. I would therefore suggest that a 19" widescreen gives an optimum viewing experience for a desktop PC.

In the Rugby League 4 Nations competition held in November, England produced a vastly improved overall performance than in 2008's World Cup, however were beaten in the Final 46-16 by Australia. The score line did not truly reflect a great effort, where things were very close for 60 of the 80 minutes. Unfortunately in the end Australia's class shone through.

Leeds Rhinos had an excellent 2009 Super League season, again beating St. Helens in the October Grand Final held at Manchester United's Old Trafford. This victory was a record third year in a row with a score of 18-10.

November has also seen the Grand Slam of Darts, screened live on ITV4. Players from both the PDC (Professional Darts Corporation) and the BDO (British Darts Organisation) came together to battle it out. This annual tournament starts off with 3 game / 4 player groups, each of which is first to 5 legs. It then moves on to a first to 10 legs knockout competition based on the final group standings. The 2009 winner was Phil Taylor of the PDC after a master class 16-2 victory over the BDO's Scott Waites in the final.

Burnley's excellent start to the 09/10 season in the Premier League continues. If the table was written on home form alone we are third only to Chelsea and Arsenal! Away form has been poor and we sit at the bottom with Hull and local rivals Blackburn. However this balances out to a rather respectable mid table position overall. I don't think there are many outside the realms of north western claret and blue would have predicted that in early August?

Very shortly we will be supplying, in association with Carillion (the authors), the PSA Schedule of Rates in pdf format on a Secure Usb Flash Drive, a Flash Drive is like a memory stick. As a security measure the Flash Drive will not permit any copying or printing of data. One benefit of being in pdf format is that a word search is possible to locate an item, saving going through various sections of a printed schedule trying to locate an item. You can also carry the Flash Drive with you, it is very small, and whilst on site plug it into any pc, no carrying round the large book. Being able to supply schedules electronically will overcome the problem that some people have had with not being able to purchase a hard copy of a PSA Schedule when out of print. The first schedule available will be the PSA Building Works Tenth Edition 2009 and if you are interested then please contact us. The price will be the same as for the printed schedule, that is £270 plus VAT. Extra copies will be cheaper. Also let us know if interested in any other schedule on Flash Drive.

The PSA Building Works Tenth Edition 2009 has now been released and we are well on the way to creating the database. The new Mechanical and Electrical schedules look like they will appear towards the end of next year.

Occasionally users contact us to see if they can get assistance with processing measures. There are several QS users who can provide this service and if you would like assistance then contact me and I will put you in touch with them.

This will allow customers to order goods directly over the Internet, this will also show live stock figures and allow customers to purchase items direct, creating new accounts and being able to see their invoices directly on line. Once complete, we would hope to move to the next step and open this out to enable you to offer your customers the ability to look at their accounts online, run simple reports, print off copy invoices, delivery notes etc and longer term even allow customers to place stock orders over the internet. It's all very exciting and if you have any ideas and thoughts about this possible further development, then we would only be too happy to listen and speak with you about it.

Our Route Management software has had another facelift.

Now you can turn routes on and off. This is especially useful if you want to setup summer and winter routes. Note also the 'copy' button – This allows you to copy a complete route to another one, even on a different day.

The price matrix is based on the size tables pricing band, and can have different selling mark ups for each band. These prices are then stored on the stock record and used for ordering and providing a starting point for wearer residual value calculations. You decide when placing the order if you wish to use the on-shore or off-shore cost.





We had added a few extra reports too, like producing invoice values by rep or business code, reps visits report (which you can now grade too!) and a new delivery note report, giving a summary list of deliveries entered over a date range.

Our Pool Linen Module now has the facility to invoice loan stock separately at a contract agreed price. The invoice has a full backing sheet detailing all the loans for a customer, making it easy for your customers to reconcile their invoice. All loan details are stored for the life of the invoice.

As well as continuing to enhance our existing portfolio, we will be looking at a short term hire module in the New Year and also spending some time investigating how best to present key performance indicator (KPI's) information.

Once again thanks to all of you who have helped drive the software forward this year, and I look forward to helping you meet your software needs over the next 12 months.
