So what's been happening since the last time we spoke?

Well, we have been working with quite a few of you in the last few months to help make the software work even better for you and your companies.

I am very excited about the development work we are doing with Zip Textiles, as this will take us into a whole new area of possibilities. We are in the programming stage of some Web Development work that will initially give the customer the ability to enter the soiled list via an online web page. This will then get processed and produce the standard Pack Print, Delivery Note and Bag Labels that the system already produces. Once this has been released and bedded down we hope to take the development much further to hopefully give the customer a virtual online account, allowing such things as Invoice Information, Reports etc; that they can access online. We hope this development work will be available from Autumn 2011. Please feel free to ask for any further information or give me your thoughts and ideas which I will be quite happy to talk to you about during my site visits, which I am in the process of arranging.

We have also been shown some exciting new developments on the 'Chip' front. Manufacturers are now claiming that you will be able to push through a cage full of work that has been 'Tagged', and the readers will be able to read all the tags that are in the cage. Although you may think that you have heard this all before, it finally looks like they have the reliability right, so they may not be that far away from this all being available. This could take tracking to a whole new level, they have the technology and, if they can get the pricing right, then the sky is the limit! Watch this space for further updates on the progress of this one.

As I have mentioned above, you should all be getting or maybe have already received an email to arrange a site visit, from which you will be able to have a look at what's new and whether or not any of our new developments can be of use to you and your company. Anyway, talking of looking ahead, just think only around another 23 weeks or so till Christmas! Come on Santa!



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The PSA Mechanical and Electrical Schedules in hardcopy were delayed because of printing problems, but have recently been released. Our copies should be arriving very soon. From then on Debbie and myself will be hard at work preparing the databases, happy days. Let us hope that there are not too many new items to type in.

We have been generating a bespoke Job Sheet for a new user, there will then be two versions of Job Sheet that we have generated. If any of you have a requirement for the system to generate a Job Sheet for an Order/Job using existing data, then please give us a ring, the quotation should not be very high.



We still have quite a number of companies purchasing the Psa data from us in Excel format. I always feel that we have failed when this happens, as I do not see where Excel can possibly compete with a system written for MTCs, be it ours or anyone else's. But many people are very comfortable with Excel and I guess that is why they make that decision. I would dearly like the opportunity to try to convince them otherwise.

Increasingly users are exporting Orders to Excel and then either emailing them to the Client or their representative or using the data internally. The other option for the emailing of Orders is to send them to a pdf file and attaching it to an email. The only problem with Excel is that versions of it can react differently with our program, involving us searching the net to see if there is an easy fix. There usually is, but finding it takes a lot of time. This is often coupled with testing it in the office on the relevant version. Good old Microsoft (not).

Several months ago there were innumerable enquiries from companies who were tendering for MTCs abroad, Gibraltar, Cyprus, Afghanistan. Obviously the MOD were having them all retendered. From recent enquiries it appears that none have yet been let.

A new user needs the Nsr Access Audit schedule as well as others. This is the first time that we have supplied it.

Recent additions to the system;

You are now able to alter the printer font by clicking on Printer on the main menu and then Select Printer Options. Be careful with the option selected as many (or most) will not fit on the page. Also, the printer currently selected can be changed, obviously useful on a network.

You can alter the screen resolution by clicking on System Configuration, then Enter/Amend System Variables (Program Defaults/Actions - Part 1). At the bottom is Alter Screen Resolution, this can be changed to any valid setting on the pc. Thereafter, whenever the system is entered, the new screen resolution will be used and upon exiting the original setting will be reverted to. On the downside, when Global Schedule of Rates is running, any other program will appear with that screen resolution, but will appear with the original screen resolution when Global Schedule of Rates is exited.

On Print and Display Order details there is an additional option to allow both Brief and Long Descriptions to be listed, previously only one could be selected.

In the Quantity Used per Schedule Code report, a new option has been added. Beneath the Commence Processing Orders button is the Process Totals per Order button. This enables a report to be generated showing for each order, the total value of Building items, total M&E, Dayworks, etc. It can be displayed, printed or exported to Excel.

With the M&E schedules on PSA there are A and B rates. On Enter Order Details, if an A rate is entered and no associated B rate then a warning message is given. The system can be set so that this message does not appear. Click on System Configuration, Enter/Amend System Variables (Program Defaults/Actions - Part 1), midway down the left-hand side is the message 'Mechanical + Electrical, do not show warning message if no associated 'B' rate entered', tick if the warning message is not required.



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
It's all about Linen It's all about Linen

You are able to select individual quotes to convert, and can see any quotes where you are currently short on stock. The stock enquiry will give a complete list of all stock required for the selected quotes and enable you to transfer stock to fulfil orders.




You are able to move the balances to ensure sufficient stock.
